Projects discussed:

- 1. Paint the church walls, with the exception of the stenciled area.
- 2. Paint hallways by the Fireside and Emmaus Rooms.
- 3. Clean the wood paneling in the Good Samaritan Center. HNOJ would provide the product to clean and restore the oil to the wood so it looks brighter, warmer.
- 4. Restore the paved walkway up to the ball field. It's sunken, so we'd need to (1) pull out the pavers placing them on the side in the same pattern/order, (2) install a new base, (3) reinstall the pavers. It would probably only take a few guys since it involves maintaining the pattern that's there.
- 5. To the extent that time allows, assist with summer painting in the school hallways.

It was felt that the Knights could accomplish most if not all of these projects over time. The ideal time for these projects would be during the summer months with school out and good weather.

Subject: 2015-2016 Fraternal Year Transition

Goals: Discuss next fraternal year's activities, support functions and assignments with an emphasis on

membership recruitment and retention strategies.

Conclusions/Discussion:

1. Emphasis on Committee Structure - Chair, Membership, and Responsibilities

Discussion: To aid in the transition, a move towards a committee structure will help clarify activities to be undertaken next year and related responsibilities – not a big change from what we're already doing. Committees would have more ownership of their function - a greater degree of freedom to act while staying within parameters defined by the Council. There will be less reliance on the Grand Knight. The chair of each committee would need to be clearly communicated with HNOJ admin, i.e. the Grand Knight would not always be their primary contact.

...the head of the seminary in the province of Butare, Rwanda, where we work, will be coming soon to do missionary appeals. The seminary needs a new well desperately. His name is Fr. Denis and besides running the seminary, he has also taken on serving as the director of our school. He's a very warm person, easy to chat with and so good at telling you little tidbits of what life is like living in Rwanda. For instance, a few minutes of conversation led to him telling me how Rwanda families who live in less populated areas and without running water or electricity will wash/bathe outside after dark. No worries about getting a hard packed dirt floor wet that way. And the kitchens with their cooking fires are outside anyway. Obviously, it is also very private because you still might have neighbors close-by. I could also go on about how important it is for American Catholics to support seminaries like this one. Practically speaking, there are so many more young men there who are interested in becoming priests which can help our need for more priests, besides our call to support evangelization globally. Any thoughts on how the HNOJ might be able to informally help him? He is scheduled to speak at some churches in the Midwest and will be here visiting Kris Worm of Lift up their Hearts and her family for a week or so.
