RE: District Deputy Report – January 2019

New Year Message

May you all have a blessed and successful new year!

If you are a bit overwhelmed with all the new programs and requirements under the new Faith in Action model, you're not alone. Here's my attempt at simplifying:

The Basics

<u>First and foremost</u>, embrace the four new categories of the Faith in Action model: **Faith, Family, Community**, and **Life**. Put aside for now techniques on how to grow membership. Instead, reflect upon on each of these four areas and think about how your council could best respond – knowing that grounded in our faith, we are called as Knights to serve. If done prayerfully, your actions will speak for themselves. The numbers will take care of themselves. The youth will want to join our ranks! And ultimately our families, community and the unborn will be better served.

<u>Secondly</u>, in order to comply with the minimums under the new model, councils should complete the required program in each of the categories:

• Faith: Spiritual Reflection Program

Family: Consecration to the Holy Family

• Community: Helping Hands

• Life: Novena for Life

Councils should review the program descriptions found at https://kofc.org/faithinaction. However, given proper intent, they should feel free to develop their own programs.

Thirdly, hold a planning meeting. Discuss all ideas and make decisions on how to proceed.

Requirements for Awards under the Faith in Action Model

To achieve Columbian Award, a council must now complete four programs under each of the four categories (Faith, Family, Community, and Life) for a total of 16 programs. Again - review recommended programs found at https://kofc.org/faithinaction. Pay special attention to the programs labeled "Featured" as these programs will satisfy two of the four programs required under each category.

To achieve Star Council, a council must satisfy the requirements for Columbian Award <u>and</u> achieve their membership and insurance quotas:

✓ Wayzata: 9 new members and 3 new insurance members
 ✓ Loretto: 4 new members and 3 new insurance members
 ✓ Long Lake: 4 new members and 3 new insurance members
 ✓ Medina: 10 new members and 3 new insurance members
 ✓ Golden Valley: 5 new members and 3 new insurance members

The application deadline for Columbian and Star Council is June 30th. Review the online application form (SP-7) at http://kofc.org/un/en/forms/council/columbian_awardap_p.pdf. (This and other program forms and their due dates can be accessed from www.kofc.org/forms.) I suggest that you use this application as a guide to track your council activities.

The Application deadline for State Council awards is April 1st. Know that much of the information entered on the Columbian Award application is transferrable to the State applications.

Summary

In summary, a council could actually forget all the recruitment techniques, the incentives, the detailed program descriptions, the pressure to grow the order and even the awards as long as the council **sincerely embraces the Faith in Action model.** If done right, no dictate from Supreme or the State Council should be a match for what a council could accomplish on its own.
